Then came 'Operation flood' in 1970, involving nearly 170 million people. It is the world's biggest dairy development programme.

Under its aegis, six million dairy owners in1,75,000 village cooperatives, produce, process and market milk to 500 cities and towns throughout India. The programme has helped stabilize milk prices, reduce India's dependence on milk imports, ensure the supply of hygienic milk and provide a source of regular income to small farmers and others. Operation Flood has now expanded to included fruits, vegetables and oilseeds
